WWI Celebration

We, as a Parish Council, were very pleased with the way that everything went from the 11am Service of Remembrance to the last chorus of Rule Britannia and hope everyone enjoyed the day as much as we did.

134th Durham Miners Gala

Sherburn Collieries Banner Group along with a bus load of local residents joined over 200,000 on the day and what a day it was! The annual gathering stretches back to 1871 and is associated with the coal mining heritage (and particularly that of miners' trade unionism) of the Durham Coalfield, which stretched throughout the traditional County of Durham. It is locally called "The Big Meeting" or "Durham Big Meeting".

The highlight for me and most is being able to parade our Sherburn Banner as we marched through the cobbled streets onto the Old

Racecourse, where political speeches were delivered and families had picnics. Following the speeches Bill bragg was on stage to wow the crowds.

In keeping with recent years, the weather was great with clear skies and the sun shone brightly on the crowds, brass band instruments and the banners. Our village was very well represented with former miners, families, visitors, County and Parish Councillors. This year Sherburn were supported by the Uppermill Brass Band from Saddleworth who were commissioned by the Banner Group.

The day commenced at 7.30am when we began to meet up, check the banner and harnesses were all in good order. Families met at the war memorial in the village, with children some f the first to arrive, all excited and some even teaching adults how to floss; the new dance craze. We left at 8am for Durham to meet the band and other marchers at 8.30am at the top of the North Road and did not arrive back in Sherburn until around 6pm where we concluded the day in the Club listening to The Uppermill Band before their long journey home.



This year's Gala was also special because a documentary chronicling the history of the Gala and what it means to different people was made. The production of the film started some months ago and the film director and his team spent time with me in my home and around the village before returning on Gala Day to follow our journey throughout the day. It is worthy to note that despite 53 years since the last colliery closed in the Sherburn, our history and heritage is recognised and celebrated.

As a former miner and with my deep links to the NUM and Durham Miners' Association, it

makes me immensely proud to join

people from my own community to march and enjoy the special day with special people. I hope more of you join us next year on 13th July. You will not be disappointed.

Organising the annual trip to the Gala and funding the costs is a year long process. Special thanks to my fellow members of the Sherburn Collieries Banner Group, Friends of the Durham Miners' Gala, County Councillors Bill Kellett & David Hall and Sherburn Parish Council. Without their time and kind donations to assist with the costs, we may not be in a position to make the trip collectively as a community.

The centre has just completed installing new security fire doors to the side and rear of the premises and a single security door at the side of the premises. We thank the county councilors for their help in securing funding for these doors and a donation from the Parish Council for auxiliary items and fittings. Thanks go to the three volunteers who helped with the installation.

A lot of small improvements and repairs have been done during the last year at a cost of £2,920.00. Some of these were upgrading the ladies and gents' toilets, new organ, painting the outside facia and letting, WWI Exhibition, painting of the interior and electrical repairs.

We held our Annual General Meeting in March and were successful in recruiting new committee members. The centre had a deficit last year, mainly due to running costs and the loss of three groups during the year. The centre lost the Mother & Toddler group, Karate and the Spiritualist Church due to retirements from two of the groups.

We are looking for replacement groups, especially on:

- Monday daytime and the 8pm slot until 9 pm.
- Wednesday evening from 5pm to 9pm

Friday mornings.

We are intending to move the bar in the small hall to make easier access to the bar and toilets and possible catering for wedding parties.

We are putting plans in operation for:

- St Cuthbert's fundraising coffee morning on June 15th, 2019
- "The Roxi Tart" concert on Saturday November 23rd, 2019
- Christmas Fayre in conjunction with the Parish Council "Christmas Tree Lights Switch on" on Saturday December 7th, 2019
- Christmas Decorating of the centre in December

Membership is £1.50 per year.




Your Village needs your Help

Our Youth workers, Rachael Roberts and Stephen Davison have been delivering detached youth work and sporting activities every Wednesday evening from 6-8pm using the area around the gymnastics centre with 25 regular attendees aged 8+. We have kindly been given a room within the Gymnastics Centre to run a youth club from and are currently working with the young people on a funding bid with Durham AAP to get the room decorated and equipped the way they want. We hope to move into the centre very soon.

Many of the young people enjoyed a visit to Moor House where they participated in Orienteering, the group had a brilliant time, and the young people worked well as a team and supported on another. We have recently been awarded £2,000 from Tesco's and would like to thank everyone who put tokens in our box to support us. This money will be used towards activities for the young people in Sherburn Village.

The community centre will be holding its Christmas fare at the same time refreshments will also be available. The parish council will be selling memory baubles in aid of the Durham Food Bank and collecting food items, toiletries and Christmas foods.

We have had a busy summer building a podium in the main hall for our fast & tumble track as we have had a raised pit installed which will enable our athletes to train more complex skills in a much safer way. Funds towards this work were raised by our fundraising committee through a fun day in July. Work has started on the extension which will enable us to move the tumble tracks to here to ensure a safer working environment and enable a sprung floor to be put down for the cheerleading section. Unfortunately, our bid to secure funding for the build has fallen through but we have secured some funding from elsewhere to allow the work to be completed, hopefully, by the end of October.

Our next aim is to purchase a sprung floor for which we need approximately £18,000. This will help our Cheerleading squad train on a floor that they will be competing on. It is their aim to become one of the best squads in the country. In the future it is our intention to update the toilet facilities to increase the number of disabled toilets and baby changing facilities.

As we now have gymnastics classes running 7 days a week as well as club classes daily we have taken the decision to stop running children's parties to accommodate the increase in demand for our club and general members. We now introduced ballet classes on Saturdays from 1-3pm and as from September the newly formed Sherburn Youth group are using a room in the centre on a Wednesday evening and we are very pleased to support this venture. The centre is also a drop off point for donations to Durham Foodbank. The parent and toddler group continue to meet on Friday mornings, 9.30 to 11.30am and will be more child friendly once the bigger equipment has been moved over into the extension.

17 of tumbling gymnasts have made it through to the finals of the British Tumbling Championships, which are also doubling as the trials for the World Championships, and hopefully some of our tumblers may be selected for this event. A weekend of competitions, bringing the best tumbling gymnasts from the north of England to our venue, on the $1^{\rm st}$ & $2^{\rm nd}$ December.

The annual Christmas displays will run from 15th to 18th December. Tickets will be available from the beginning of November and you are all invited to see our gymnasts in action.

As your local County Councillors, David Hall & Bill Kellett were elected to by local residents to serve your interests and bring as much of the County Council's & other organisations resources & attention to the area and to support local residents, groups, businesses & Parish Council for the benefit of the area in any way we can.

Durham Area Youth — a new youth group which has been set up in the village and is running out of room at Durham City Gymnastics. Feedback has been very positive so far with many children engaging in the outreach service. (See DAY article for more information)

Dropped Kerbs – Wheelchairs users can now benefit from the new dropped kerbs which were requested including the lessening of the slope on the one near the Coop.

Resurfaced paths, roads, new road signs & dog bins – Front Street & Gray Avenue paths have been redone/resurfaced. New street signs installed with others on order in the next few months as are new dog bins in some areas. Poor road & paths condition have been reported i.e. Cummings Avenue, Coalford Road, Kidd Avenue. Resurfacing has or will take place in other areas. Residents can report theirs directly too via help@durham.gov.uk & emailing their County Councillors.

County Councillors have contributed some funding to the Parish Council project to do some verge hardening in the village. They are also looking at the affordability of additional parking bays for Gray Avenue and Park House Gardens, the latter we are talking to County Durham Housing Group to see what they can do to help. The Parish would like to develop a rolling programme of projects. The call to attend a meeting for a proposed Parish Plan to develop this was not met with any response but the Parish will try again next year.

Sherburn Primary School Play Equipment – Significant funding has been committed to new play equipment which is been matched by the school to replace outdated equipment. We look forward to seeing this project roll out this year and to see the County Council's promised £1m investment in the school start to take place in the new year.

Sherburn to Dragonville Path – this was completed a little while ago completing the ability for all to use the path for its entire length. Had this request been made now then the chances of the project giving funding would have been impossible now due to Government austerity measures so it is fortunate that this was requested in 2013.
